What made my journey so powerful were the people I met and hiked with along the way, the drastically different types of weather I encountered, the endless vista I set my eyes on and the wild situations I found my self in. This can be

A last Send Off Eternal Ascent Society

In 1994 Joanie and Clyde West owned a business called "Gift in a Balloon". It was essentially a Party Store that sold wedding and party related items with the main focus being balloons with various items inside (i.e., hats, flowers, chocolates, etc.).



One night they were having dinner with friends and Order on-line: www.PennsylvaniaCremationServices.com/get-your-free-book they were discussing a mutual acquaintance who was very ill. The conversation turned to "what do you want to have done with you after you are gone?" When it was Clyde's turn he said, "I don't care. Just have me cremated, put me in a balloon and send me off". The idea for the Eternal Ascent Society was born.

The service is elegantly simple. After processing the cremated remains they place them in a 5-foot, biodegradable balloon. They inflate the balloon with As a fifth generation funeral services provider, Corey Strauch has Helium inside a patented inflation chamber, transport the balloon in the inflation chamber to a site chosen by the family and release it to the heavens. When released, the balloon slowly ascends to a height of approximately 30,000 feet. During the balloon's ascent it expands and at a height of approximately 6 miles (where it is 40 degrees below zero) it freezes and fractures, scattering the ashes to the four winds.

After extensive research and testing Joanie and Clyde contacted a patent attorney and on October 15, 1996 the Eternal Ascent Society received a

U.S. Patent (#5,564,260) for the idea and process of placing cremated remains of a human or pet in a balloon filled with a lighter than air gas and releasing it to the heavens. The Inflation Chamber is also part of the patent. They have since obtained Trademark protection for the name and logo.
